

Coronavirus (COVID-19) information for teachers



COVID-19 symptoms can develop within

2 to 14

days of exposure.



Cough



Fever



Shortness of breath



Sore throat



Headache

Other symptoms include:
Body aches and pains
Weakness or fatigue
Severe respiratory distress

You could get the virus if:

- You come into **close contact** with someone who has the virus and is coughing.
- You **touch** an object or surface with the virus on it, then **touch your mouth, nose or eyes** before washing your hands.

COVID-19 can only be diagnosed with a laboratory test.

There is no specific treatment or vaccine for COVID-19.

Protect yourself and others



Practice good hand and respiratory hygiene.



Avoid close contact with people who are coughing.



Stay at home if you are ill.



Wipe down all surfaces with disinfectant.



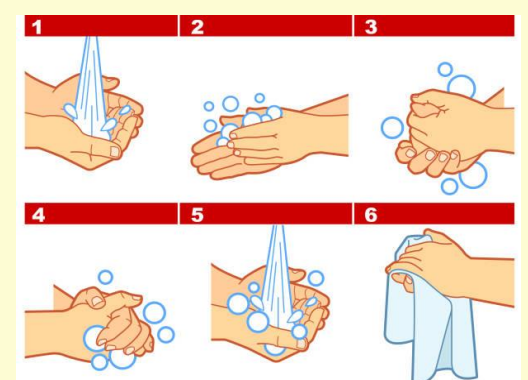
Wear a mask if you have symptoms.

Teachers should

- Help learners remain calm and understand the facts of COVID-19.
- Promote good hand and respiratory hygiene to learners.
- Ensure adequate ventilation and sunlight in the classrooms.
- Routinely clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that children frequently touch.
- Wear gloves when touching or marking books etc.

Wash your hands well

- Wash for around 20 seconds.
- When washing your hands with soap and warm water, do not forget to wash in-between your fingers and the backs of your hands.



What to do if you suspect you have been exposed to COVID-19

- Alert the school officials and contact your health care provider immediately for further assessment.
