- Creates a loop-hole for employers

Roles and responsibilities

Employers

- To ensure health and safety in the workplace
- Appoints H & S representatives

Workers

 Report unsafe work to health and safety reps

Challenges

- Job insecurity is not catered for in legislation.
 Workers push the boundaries due to low wages
- Labour brokers add to the vulnerability of workers and need to be addressed holistically
- Education and Training not covering all categories of workers (management)
- No National Policy
- Advocacy is lacking

Way forward

- Inculcate a culture of health and safety earlier, perhaps at school level to effect sustainable behaviour change
- Holding the employers accountable
- Increase enforcement capacity
- Empower workers to stop dangerous work (like in the MHSA)
