
15 April 2021

- 1 March 2020 South African tour group returns from Italy;
- 5 March 2020 First confirmed COVID-19 case in SA announced. A 38 year old man tested positive in KZN;
- 7 March 2020 Second confirmed case in SA (39 Year old Female from Gauteng);
- 11 March 2020 6 new cases reported in SA (1 case from the same travel group from Italy but 5 other cases without a travel history to other European countries);
  - WHO confirms global COVID-19 pandemic;
- 14 March 2020 Western Cape reports teenager tested positive (first case < 18 years in SA; All cases were > 30 years);
- 15 March 2020 President declares a national state of disaster (travel restrictions imposed and closure of schools);
- 17 March 2020 First confirmed local transmission cases were announced by government;
- 23 March 2020 President announces Lockdown level 5 starting 27 March 2020 for 21 days – until 16 April 2020;
  - · Only essential services and businesses to continue
  - No alcohol or cigarette sales permitted
  - Citizens may not travel or attend any form of gatherings
- 27 March 2020 First COVID-19 death reported in SA;

- 1 May 2020 Gradual easing of lock down restrictions to alert level 4;
- 1 June 2020 National restrictions were lowered to alert level 3:
  - Total number of confirmed cases 151 209 and 2657 deaths;
  - More than 1 million COVID tests performed;
- 9 July 2020 The highest number of confirmed infections in one day was recorded 13 674;
- 17 August 2020 Restrictions lowered to alert level 2;
- 21 September 2020 Restrictions lowered to alert level 1;
  - Total confirmed cases 672 572 and 16 667 deaths;



- 9 December 2020 Minister of Health announces that SA has entered the second wave;
- 18 December 2020 Minister of Health announces the discovery of a new variant of coronavirus (501Y.V2);
- 27 December 2020 Number of confirmed cases in SA reaches 1 million;
- 29 December 2020 Lockdown was tightened from adjusted level 1 to an adjusted level 3;

1 Million confirmed positive cases

- 3 January 2021 Minister of Health reveals SA COVID-19 vaccine strategy (aiming for 67% of the country's population to be vaccinated to achieve herd immunity);
- 1 February 2021 First batch of Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccines (AZD1222) arrive in SA;
- 6 February 2021 Reports emerge that provisional trial data of the Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine show reduced efficacy to the 501Y.V2 strain;
- 7 February 2021 Minister of Health suspends the rollout of approximately 1 million doses of Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccines in SA;
- 17 February 2021- National COVID-19 vaccination strategy was started through the Sisonke Program using the Johnson and Johnson (JnJ) vaccine (Ad26.COV2S);
- 1 March 2021 Easing of restrictions from adjusted level 3 to adjusted level 1;
  - Confirmed cases 1 548 157 / deaths 52 846;
- 13 April 2021 SA National COVID Vaccination (Sisonke program)
  has been temporarily suspended as a precautionary measure to
  allow for further investigation, following concerns raised in the US of
  a rare side effect (reported in 6 cases from the approximately 6.8
  million persons vaccinated with the JnJ vaccine);
- 13 April 2021 Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs has extended the national state of disaster to the 15 May 2021.


