WORKERS IN THE TAXI INDUSTRY CRONAVIRUS (COVID-19) HOW TO STAY SAFE

TAXI DRIVERS – ensure that: You use a facial mask to protect yourself from airborne germs Every passenger boarding the vehicle has a properly worn facial mask, to protect you and themselves Use a hand sanitiser in between and after contact with money, passengers and colleagues Passengers disinfect their hands before boarding the vehicle (use a hand sanitiser before boarding) **0 0** Ensure there is adequate air movement within the taxi- windows open to allow air movement across the taxi Are you are vaccinated against COVID-19? If not, go to sacoronavirus.co.za to find your nearest vaccination centre **MARSHALLS** – ensure that: Taxis are cleaned in between passengers, using approved cleaning products and disinfectants, especially the passenger seats, where money is kept and the taxi handles Provision of accessible hand sanitiser (with at least 70% alcohol) for use by drivers and passengers at any stage. Are you are vaccinated against COVID-19 to ensure reduction of the spread of infection? **TAXI OWNER & RANK COMMITTEES – ensure that:**

- COVID-19 infection and vaccination information is provided to drivers and passengers
- Hand-cough and sneeze hygiene is emphasized

LABORATORY SERVICE

Taxis must be sanitised after every trip with 70% alcohol disinfectant or soap



As a driver, **if you are sick**, arrange with your employer to test and stay at home once confirmed that you have COVID-19. If you're not sick, but have a **laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 positive contact person, there is no need to quarantine but monitor for symptoms**.
